University of Siena - Categories of International Students and Visa Requirements for Enrollment in Degree Programs

For admission purposes to the degree programs at the University of Siena, students will be classified as summarized in the table below.

COMMENTS

Non-EU nationals holding an Italian residence permit for study purposes, who entered Italy to enroll in an Italian university, are exempt from the requirement to obtain a new visa **only if both of the following conditions are met**:

- 1. **The requirements for the renewal of the residence permit for study purposes are fulfilled** for example, the student has passed at least one exam after having received the residence permit for the first time.
- 2. The continuation of their academic studies can be clearly demonstrated, specifically in the following cases:
 - The student is currently enrolled in an Italian university program and intends to transfer to a new program at the University of Siena. It is essential
 that the student does **not** formally withdraw from their studies at the university of origin **before** the transfer is completed; otherwise, the residence
 permit will immediately become invalid.
 - The student has successfully passed the assessment for at least one individual university course. If the student intends to enroll in a second-cycle degree program (e.g., a Master's degree), the individual course must be consistent with the academic focus of the intended program.
 - The student has successfully completed a pre-academic program (Foundation Year) recognized in Italy.
 - The student has obtained the academic qualification required for admission to the new degree program at the University of Siena.

In all other cases, the University of Siena will not allow enrollment in a degree program without a new visa.

NOTICE: Non-EU students holding a residence permit for study purposes **are not considered EU-equated citizens**. However, depending on their specific status (as outlined above), they may not be required to obtain a new visa in order to continue their studies.
